Early Voting Basics

2010 marks the first time Maryland has had Early Voting and many people are confused about when, where, and, most importantly, how to vote early. Part of your role as District or Precinct Leader will be leading efforts to educate voters in your neighborhood about the early voting process.

I. Who can Early Vote?

Any person registered to vote in Baltimore County may do so at any of the five early voting locations, regardless of where their normal polling place is.

II. Where can I Early Vote in Baltimore County?

There are five Early Voting locations in Baltimore County. They are:

- *Towson University Administrative Building, 7720 York Rd., Towson*
- *Catonsville Community Center, 106 Bloomsbury Ave., Catonsville*
- *Honeygo Community Center, 9033 Honeygo Blvd., Perry Hall*
- *North Point Library, 1716 Merritt Blvd., Baltimore*
- *Randallstown Community Center, 3505 Resource Dr., Randallstown*

III. When can I Early Vote?

All early voting locations are open from 10 AM until 8 PM daily. Early voting for the Primary Election begins Friday, September 3rd and runs through Thursday, September 9th (excluding Sunday). For the General Election, early voting opens Friday, October 22nd and closes Thursday, October 28th (excluding Sunday).

IV. Why do we want to get Democrats to the polls early?

- Allows us/campaigns to reach more voters. Early voters are marked in VoteBuilder.
- Increases Democratic turnout. Dems have registration advantage in county, but turn out at lower rate than Republicans.
